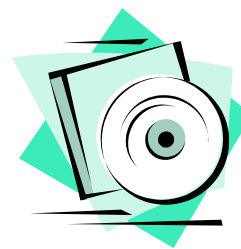

The incidence of serious injury or of death within the confines of the dental office is, happily, quite low. However, on occasion, such problems do occur. In recent times national television news magazines have publicized the deaths of several patients undergoing dental care. In this presentation, Dr. Malamed will review these and a number of other cases, illustrating what went wrong, and what could have been done either to prevent the incident from occurring in the first place or, failing that, what should have been done to produce a better outcome.

Stanley F. Malamed, DDS, graduated from the New York University College of Dentistry in 1969. He then completed a dental internship and residency in anesthesiology at Montefiore Hospital and Medical Center in the Bronx before serving for 2 years in the U.S. Army Dental Corps at Ft. Knox, Kentucky. In 1973, Dr. Malamed joined the faculty of the University of Southern California School of Dentistry, where he is Professor of Anesthesia & Medicine. Dr. Malamed is also a Diplomate of the American Dental Board of Anesthesiology, as well as a recipient of the Heidebrink Award (1996) from the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology and the Horace Wells Award from the International Federation of Dental Anesthesia Societies (1997).

The utilization of dental implants has evolved from being an experimental last effort for the totally edentulous client to become in many cases the optimal treatment plan. Dental hygienists are in a unique position to initiate discussions as well as address client’s questions regarding implant therapy. Course participants will learn about the different types of dental implants and their components. The course content includes the basic steps in the surgical process, dental hygiene instrumentation techniques and oral hygiene instruction for implant clients and the role of the RDH from initial evaluation and treatment planning to long term maintenance.

Cathy Draper, RDH, MS has practiced clinical dental hygiene for 28 years in both Germany and California. She received her masters degree in dental hygiene from the University of Michigan in 1978 and has worked in an implant, cosmetic, general practice for the last 16 years in Mountain View, California. She has also worked as a library reference associate at the Stanford Hospital Health Library for nine years. She is a past president of the California Dental Hygienists’ Association and was the delegation chair for the 2002 People to People Dental Hygiene Delegation to the People’s Republic of China.
